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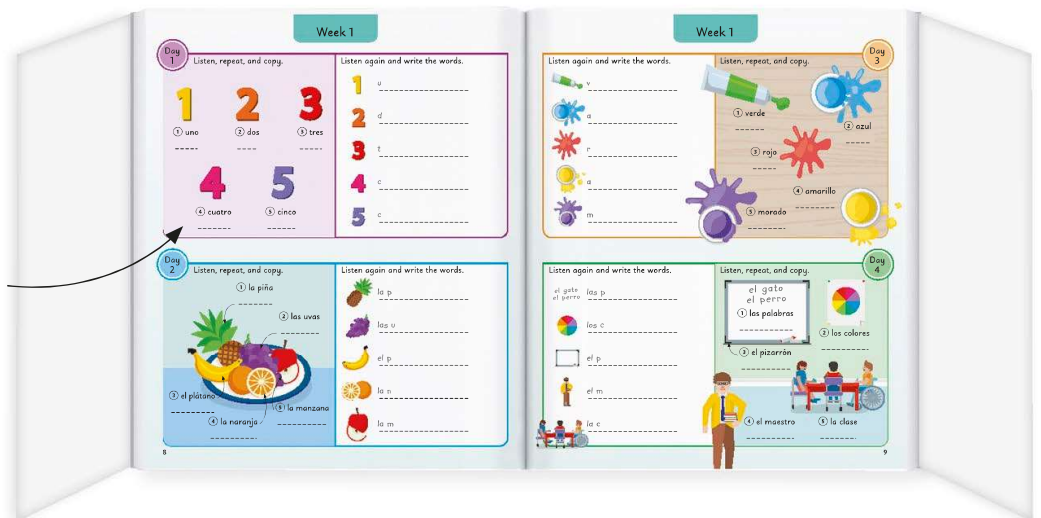
How to use this book

Spanish for Everyone Junior: 5 Words a Day is a vocabulary book for children that teaches and tests more than 1,000 Spanish words. Words are taught in weekly units of 5 days.

Learning new vocabulary

On Days 1–4, the child will be presented with 20 new words, which are taught 5 words at a time through colorful illustrations.

- 1 First, listen to the words on the audio app or website, repeat the words out loud, and then write them out in the space below each word.



Masculine and feminine words

In Spanish, all nouns (things or people) are either masculine or feminine. You will notice that many words have “el”, “la”, “los”, or “las” in front of them. These all mean “the” in English. If a word has “el” or “los” before it, it is usually masculine. Words that follow “la” or “las” are usually feminine. Singular nouns appear after “el” or “la”, and plural nouns appear after “los” or “las”.

- 2 Next, use the book flaps to cover the illustrations and listen to the words again.

- 3 With the words still covered, try writing out each word from memory.
