WHAT IS DRAFTING?

- Drafting is the initial writing stage: At this stage, writers transform their ideas into written form, laying the groundwork for the final product.
- It involves putting ideas onto paper without worrying about grammar or structure: During drafting, the primary goal is to capture thoughts and concepts as they come without being overly concerned about perfect grammar or sentence structure.
- The focus is on generating content, organizing thoughts, and developing arguments. Writers focus on expressing their ideas clearly and coherently, arranging information logically, and building persuasive arguments to support their thesis or purpose.
- Drafting serves as a foundation for the writing process: It provides a solid starting point for writers to further develop and refine their work in subsequent stages.
- It provides a starting point that can be revised and refined later on: Drafting allows writers to get their ideas down on paper, knowing that they can revisit and revise their work during the editing and revision stages to improve clarity, coherence, and effectiveness.
