Free Verse Definition:

- Free verse is a type of poetry that does not follow any specific pattern or structure.
- It is free from the constraints of meter, rhyme, or fixed forms.

Characteristics of Free Verse:

- **Absence of Rhyme Scheme:** Free verse doesn't need to rhyme. Poets can choose whether or not to use rhyme.
- **No Fixed Meter:** Free verse doesn't have a set rhythm. Poets can write naturally, following the flow of speech.
- **Varied Line Lengths:** Lines in free verse poems can be different lengths. This helps poets emphasize certain words and create their rhythm.
- **Fluid Structure:** Free verse poems can be structured however the poet wants. They can be organized in stanzas or as a single block of text.
- **Emphasis on Imagery and Emotion:** Free verse often uses vivid imagery and strong emotions. Poets can experiment with language and sensory details to create powerful experiences for readers.

Examples of Free Verse Poetry:

- *"Song of Myself" by Walt Whitman*
 - Example of free verse with its long, flowing lines and natural cadence.
- *"The Waste Land" by T.S. Eliot*
 - Shows how free verse can incorporate multiple voices and perspectives.
- *"Still I Rise" by Maya Angelou*
 - Employs free verse to convey powerful messages of resilience and strength.
