How to Count to 40

To count to 40, start at **1** and say each number in order until you reach **40**. Practice counting out loud, and you'll get better and faster!

Practice Counting

- 1. Count by Ones: Start at 1 and count each number up to 40.
- 2. **Count by Twos**: Start at 2 and skip every other number. (2, 4, 6, 8, etc.)
- 3. Count by Fives: Start at 5 and count by 5s. (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.)
- 4. Count by Tens: Start at 10 and count by 10s. (10, 20, 30, 40)
