

1st Grade Math: Position Words

Objective: Students will learn how to use position words to describe the location of objects in relation to each other.

What are Position Words?

Position words tell us where something is. These words help us describe the **location** of objects in relation to other things. Common position words include:

- **Above**
- **Below**
- **In front of**
- **Behind**
- **Next to**
- **Between**
- **Inside**
- **Outside**
- **On**
- **Under**

Examples of Position Words

1. **Above:** The ball is above the table.
2. **Below:** The cat is below the chair.
3. **In front of:** The boy is in front of the door.
4. **Behind:** The car is behind the tree.
5. **Next to:** The dog is next to the house.
6. **Between:** The book is between the two toys.
7. **Inside:** The toy is inside the box.
8. **Outside:** The girl is outside the classroom.
9. **On:** The cup is on the table.
10. **Under:** The shoes are under the bed.

How to Use Position Words

Position words help you explain where something is. You use them in sentences to describe how one object relates to another.

For example:

- **Above:** The picture is **above** the sofa.
- **Under:** The cat is **under** the table.
- **Between:** The pencil is **between** the notebook and the ruler.

Activity: Using Position Words

Materials Needed:

- A small toy or object
- A box or a chair

Instructions:

1. Place the toy in different places around the box (e.g., on the box, under the box, next to the box).
2. Ask the students to describe the toy's location using position words.

For example:

- Where is the toy?
 - "The toy is **on** the box."
 - "The toy is **next to** the box."
 - "The toy is **under** the box."

Practice with Position Words

1. **Question 1:** Where is the ball in this sentence?
 - "The ball is **under** the chair."
 - **Answer:** The ball is **under** the chair.
2. **Question 2:** Where is the book?
 - "The book is **between** the pencil and the ruler."
 - **Answer:** The book is **between** the pencil and the ruler.
3. **Question 3:** Where is the cat?
 - "The cat is **next to** the window."
 - **Answer:** The cat is **next to** the window.

Real-Life Examples of Position Words

1. **At Home:**
 - Your shoes are **under** the bed.
 - The picture is **on** the wall.
2. **At School:**
 - The backpack is **next to** the desk.
 - The chalk is **inside** the box.
