

Introduction to Word Origins

Words in English come from many different languages, but two major sources are Greek and Latin.

Often in research, you will find that word origins in science, medicine, and law come directly from Greek or Latin roots.

Understanding these origins helps us decode new words, which makes learning vocabulary easier and fun!






Parts of words fit together like pieces of a puzzle.


The root word or base word is the basic part of a word that has meaning and can be used all on its own.

An affix is one or more letters that can be added to the front or the back of a root word to change its meaning.





Vocabulary for Differnt Subjects

Have you seen these words before in other classes? Each of these contains a root word and an affix!






Common Latin Roots

 auditory)




Prefixes:

A prefix is a word or part of a word that is placed in the front of another word to change its meaning.


The meaning of the prefix can help us understand the meaning of the word.

un means not unhappy means not happy


anti means against

dis means not




Suffixes:


A suffix is a word or part of a word that is placed at the end of another word to change its meaning.

The meaning of the suffix can help us understand the meaning of the word.


er means person who does an action teacher means person who teaches




able means can be done




ed means already happened
