WHAT IS IT?

Definition of imperative sentences

An imperative sentence gives a command, makes a request, or offers advice. It often starts with a verb, like "Go" or "Please sit."

For a process essay, an imperative sentence is a sentence that gives an explicit instruction or step that the reader should follow. Example: Mix the flour and sugar in a large bowl."

WHY USE THEM?

Imperative sentences are essential for clear communication. They help in giving instructions, making requests, and guiding actions effectively.
