Research Quality (30pts)	30 pts Clear, insightful explanation with strong examples of global trade and development impact. Accurately uses 8 vocabulary terms , meets word count , and evaluates effectiveness, including impact and any criticisms.	24 pts Research is largely clear, with some details and evidence. Most vocabulary terms are used correctly. Meets most of the word count requirement.	18 pts Lacks depth or examples. Uses a few vocabulary terms or misuses terms. 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Podcast Script or Outline (20 pts)	20 pts Script or outline is well-organized, detailed, and clearly matches the podcast. Includes a clear evaluation of the organization's effectiveness and addresses lasting impact and potential criticisms. Includes strong structure and logical flow of ideas.	16 pts Mostly organized and reflects the podcast, though some parts may be underdeveloped.	12 pts Script lacks clarity or organization. May not align well with podcast content.	8 pts Script is poorly written or incomplete. Difficult to follow.	0 pts No script submitted.
Podcast Recording (30 pts)	30 pts Podcast is 3–5 minutes, clear, engaging, and well-paced. Demonstrates strong understanding of the topic with accurate and thoughtful delivery.	24 pts Podcast meets time requirement and communicates ideas clearly, though lacks energy or depth in places.	18 pts Podcast is unclear, off-topic, or does not meet time requirements. Delivery lacks clarity or flow.	12 pts Podcast is hard to follow or minimally developed. Does not demonstrate understanding.	0 pts No podcast submitted.

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Creativity and Engagement (10 pts)	10 pts Podcast is highly engaging and creative. Strong use of tone, structure, or storytelling keeps the listener interested throughout.	8 pts Good effort to engage the listener; some creative elements present.	6 pts Minimal creativity. Limited audience engagement.	4 pts Lacks effort to maintain listener interest.	0 pts No effort to create an engaging presentation/animation.
Clarity, Organization, Writing Quality, and MLA Citations (10 pts)	10 pts Well-organized, clear, and coherent. Proper MLA citations used throughout (in-text and Works Cited). No grammar/spelling errors.	8 pts Writing is mostly clear, with some grammar/spelling errors. MLA citations mostly correct, with minor issues.	6 pts Writing lacks clarity or structure. Multiple grammar/spelling errors. MLA citations incomplete or contain errors.	4 pts Writing is difficult to follow. Numerous grammar/spelling errors. MLA citations missing or incorrect.	0 pts No writing submitted or MLA citations entirely missing or incorrect.
